


To increase the number of globally competent high school graduates from central Ohio high schools.


Lessons Learned


- Interaction with other students and experts was highly valued.

GSD Program Growth



Global Scholars Program Overview



In a world where the boundaries between cultures and countries are becoming a relic of the past, it is imperative that we educate students in a manner that will allow them to compete and collaborate globally. The *Global Scholars Diploma* credential is designed to acknowledge students who demonstrate global competencies above and beyond the curriculum requirements at Granville High School. Students who earn this credential will create a portfolio for presentation of these competencies at the end of their senior

year at GHS. The four categories of competencies that will be assessed are: *investigating the world, recognizing perspectives, communicating ideas and taking action*. Students will have opportunities and requirements for this credential that are in the community, school-based, and self-directed. The capstone piece to the portfolio is an action research or service learning project and presentation to the <u>GlobalEd Network Committee</u>, sponsor of the Global Scholars Diploma. The GlobalEd Network is a function of the <u>Columbus Council on World Affairs</u> (CCWA).

Global Scholars Diploma Requirements All of the items listed below are mandatory unless otherwise noted

Year 1 & 2 Badges from the GlobalEd Network: Badges are point based and required for each year in the program. 0.5 elective credits will be awarded for each badge, and a badge is required to move on in the program. Year 3 is only required if this program is started as a freshman. Cross-cultural and career experiences and field trips organized by the GlobalEd Network and self-directed activities are the foundation of the badging benchmarks.


